What is Per Capita?

Per capita covers the expenses of the Presbyterian Church (USA) including local, regional, and overall government without reducing mission dollars. Each congregation is a part of a Presbytery, Synod, and the General Assembly and pays per capita based on the number of members reported in a previous year.

North Presbyterian pays \$40 per member whether you attend church regularly or not. Currently we have around 125 members, with weekly attendance averaging 50. We ask that you please consider donating your portion of per capita that is taken from the budget each year. 


