#### In Focus

#### The Chrismon Tree

Next time you are in church, take special note of the ornaments on our Christmas tree also known as a Chrismon tree. Every aspect of the Chrismon tree has significance, from the symbols on the ornaments to the colors they draw on. Chrismon trees are typically decked in all white and gold. The white symbolizes the perfection and purity of the Lord, while gold points to His nobility and glory. The tree's white lights are a reminder to believers that He is the Light of the world and the evergreen symbolizes our own eternal life, a gift of Christ's sacrifice for us.

#### POPULAR CHRISMON TREE SYMBOLS

- ❖ Shepherd's Crook (Staff): It symbolizes Jesus as the Good Shepherd who guides and looks after his followers.
- ❖ IHS: This is a monogram or abbreviation for the Greek word for Jesus.
- Acinbow: This symbolizes God's promise to Noah that He would never again flood the earth, often seen as a symbol of hope and promise.
- ❖ Palm Branch: It's a symbol of victory, triumph, peace, and eternal life originating in the ancient Near East and Mediterranean world.



- ❖ Nativity Scenes: These depict the birth of Jesus as described in the gospels of Matthew and Luke.
- ❖ Bread and Wine: These represent the body and blood of Christ, as introduced at the Last Supper.
- ❖ Fish: The fish, or ichthys, was a secret symbol used by early Christians to identify each other. It is an acronym for "Jesus Christ, God's Son, Savior" in Greek.

- ❖ Alpha and Omega: These are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet and represent Jesus as the beginning and the end.
- ❖ Chi-Rho: This is a monogram of chi (X) and rho (P) as the first two letters of the Greek work 'Khristos' for Christ, used as a Christian symbol.
- ❖ Star of David: This represents the lineage of Jesus through King David and also the Star of Bethlehem which guided the Wise Men.
- ❖ Dove: The dove symbolizes the Holy Spirit.
- ❖ Butterfly: The butterfly is often used to symbolize the Resurrection of Christ and the eternal life which is granted to all who believe in Him.
- ❖ Anchor: This ancient Christian symbol represents hope in Christ. The anchor was a hidden symbol of the cross in times of persecution.
- ❖ Lamb: The lamb symbolizes Jesus' role as the 'Lamb of God', a title for Jesus that appears in the Gospel of John.
- ❖ Crown: This symbol represents the Kingship of Christ. It can also symbolize the victory of the Christian martyrs, or the victory of Jesus over death.
- ❖ Chalice: Represents the Holy Communion or Eucharist. It is a reference to the Last Supper, the final meal that Jesus shared with his apostles.
- ❖ Shell: The shell symbolizes baptism or pilgrimage.
- ❖ Candle: The candle represents the light Jesus Christ brings to the world.
- \* Keys: The keys represent access to the Kingdom of Heaven.
- ❖ Scroll: The scroll represents the words and teachings of the Bible.
- ❖ Ship: The ship represents the ark of Noah in the Bible.
- ❖ Angel: The angel represents the angels who deliver messages throughout the Bible.
- Trinity Knot or Triquetra: This Celtic symbol represents the Holy Trinity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- Cross: The cross is the most recognizable symbol of Christianity, representing Jesus' sacrifice for humanity's sins.
